- Lack of space in campus.
- Difficulty in continuing students for higher study against teething employment problem.

8. Plans of institution for next year

- Encouragement to faculty members for advanced research work including completion of ongoing projects.
- Motivating students for co-curricular extracurricular activities beyond day to day learning.

Best Practices (A)

> Title of the Practice :

Liberal policy of institute to promote research activities of faculty in national and overseas universities

➤ Goal:

It is the constant endeavour of the institute to encourage the teachers to undertake research assignment for advanced knowledge in their area of specialization.

> The Context:

The vision of the college is to be a leading college in Kolkata. Consequently faculty members are encouraged to deliver to the students best of their knowledge. Association with advanced technology and research thus becomes a primary condition.

> The Practice:

The college administration sanctions study leave as per statute of Calcutta University forthwith. Governing Body records its appreciation for recipients of doctoral and post-doctoral degree holders.

Evidence of Success:

Faculty member of Electronics obtained DBT- CREST award 2012 from Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India and achieved a post doctoral visit for 4 month at Institute of Biomedical Engineering (IBME) under Department of Engineering Sciences, University of Oxford, UK.

Faculty member of Physiology attended Fourth Kolkata Liver Meeting on NAFLD/NASH-INDO-EUROPEAN SUMMIT at Taj Bengal Hotel, Kolkata on December15th & 16th, 2012.

Ongoing Minor Research Project in Economics is submitted.

Problems encountered:

Though institution is ready to sanction leave for research work and encourages to undertake new projects, but lack of manpower is a constraint in this sphere. There are a good number of Honours departments having only two full time sanctioned teaching posts.

Besides the affiliating University has a long examination schedule of practical as well as theoretical papers for which sanctioning study leave becomes a big problem. Naturally timely completion of research projects get delayed and scholars face difficulties.

Best Practices (B)

> Title of the Practice:

Sports activities organised by the Students' Union under active encouragement of the College

➢ Goal:

To establish the name of the College in the list of colleges reputed for sports activities under Calcutta University.

➤ The Context:

The vision and mission of the college is to promote a balanced system of education in which students participate in all such extra-curricular activities that will improve their health and mind. With this goal the institution provides all possible encouragement and help to the students for extra-curricular activities.

> The Practice:

Students with sports background are given preference during admission. As they are to attend regular practices and play different matches in and around the city, stipulated percentage of class attendance is relaxed in such cases. They are also provided sports uniform, shoes etc. Tuition fee concession is also made available to players. Students' Union look after their needs and contact the College authority accordingly.

Evidence of Success:

College becomes semi-finalist in the Calcutta University Inter -college Football tournament. Runners-Up in Calcutta University table tennis tournament. Quarter finalist in Inter College Cricket tournament. The College football team becomes the Champion in football tournament hosted by the Kolkata Police. Quarter finalist in NCC Cricket tournament. Besides, round the session Inter class tournament in various events and the Annual Sports are held with the enthusiastic participation of students.

> Problems encountered:

Enthusiasts with possibilities to build up career in sports are many in every academic session. Unfortunately most of them give up their pursuit in the midst of their sports career just because of financial compulsion and seek desperately for job opportunities.
