➤ **Title of the Practice:**

Organizing Annual Science Exhibition.

➤ **Goal:**

To awaken and nurture the potential of creative thinking among young learners.

➤ **The Context:**

The institution aims at enhancement of learner-centred pedagogy.

➤ **The Practice:**

Annual Science Exhibition was organised in the College on 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> October, 2015. The theme was “Save the Earth-Save our Planet-Protect the Environment”. Students prepared charts and models and demonstrated their projects. Students from neighbouring schools and colleges visited the exhibition.

➤ **Evidence of Success:**

Students from all streams – Arts, Commerce and Science participated in the Annual Science Exhibition with great enthusiasm. The number of exhibitor groups was thirty with three / four students in each group.

➤ **Problems encountered and Resource Required:**

- i) Availability of adequate space to organize the exhibition on a larger scale.
- ii) Allocation of funds for the exhibition from internal resources

## **Best Practices (B)**

➤ **Title of the Practice:**

Organizing Seminar-cum-Workshop for the aged population of the locality.

➤ **Goal:**

To involve the local community in the institution's reach- out activities.

➤ **The Context:**

The people of the locality had contributed bit by bit in initially establishing the College. Hence the College is committed to the service of the local community.

➤ **The Practice:**

The College endeavours to keep in touch with the aged people residing in the neighbourhood. As a special initiative, a one day seminar-cum-workshop "Healthy Life After Sixty" was organized jointly by the departments of Physiology, Botany and Computer Science of this College on 11<sup>th</sup> May, 2016. The senior citizens of the locality participated enthusiastically in the seminar-cum-workshop. Arrangement was made for checking blood pressure and random blood sugar of the participants, free of cost. The use of latest technology (ATM, internet, online purchase) in everyday life was also demonstrated.

➤ **Evidence of Success:**

The seminar-cum-workshop was attended mainly by the aged people of the neighbourhood. Some participants were even as aged as 75 years. The participants acknowledged that the seminar-cum-workshop had proved very helpful to them. They requested for the publication of its proceedings.

➤ **Problems encountered & Resource Required:**

- i) Availability of time within the academic session to devote for reach-out activities at more regular intervals.
- ii) Availability of funds from internal resources for such activities.
